

The Push Stick

Jim Sparling



At the WOW Christmas party, Jim Sparling gave away candle holders that were popular. He was recently making some more, so I went to see how he makes them.

These candle holders are mainly made from tree limbs, and since Jim is a first class scrounger, they are free. Unfortunately some wood does not hold onto its bark or develops cracks. He has made them successfully from Birch, Hickory, Cyprus and Eucalyptus. 4x4 lumber works too. See the dice he made in the picture.

They are made to take a 1 1/2" tea candle that he gets at CVS or Dollar Tree, so the diameter of the wood should be 2 1/2" or greater. He makes them 2", 4" and 6 inches tall to make a pleasing set. He cuts the lengths using a bandsaw. A helpful hint he learned the hard way was to hold the wood in a

wooden hand-screw clamp, so the piece does not spin. Once it did spin on him and bent the bandsaw blade.

To make the ends smooth and the holder stand up straight, he sands the ends on a belt sander. After this, Jim bores a 1 1/2" hole in the center with a Forstner bit. He drills this deep enough so the candle sits flush. For finish he uses four to five coats of Minwax clear gloss oil modified polyurethane. The smooth shiny finish gives the holder a great look.

He gives them as gifts in sets of three or four. Jim also uses round slices of the same limbs to make drink coasters or snowmen. Thanks for sharing Jim!
