In October I went to the Orange County Woodcarvers Show in Santa Ana to see what was on display. In addition to carvings they had some scroll saw works and the Gourd Society was there. They have some amazing artwork made from gourds.

I saw Mike Lisberg and John Okawa there, so we looked at the creations together. Turns out Herb Ludeking, Robert Bilevich and his wife Rita had tables, selling their wares. WOW was indirectly represented. It was fun to look at the carvings, with some having incredible details.

One guy that carved models of fish told me he takes charcoal rubbings of real fish to get the details of the scales so he can recreate them. Now that is an eye toward detail! Carving is just one part as you then have to paint the model to make it realistic. Air brushing is something you have to learn to do it right. A couple guys were outside doing chainsaw carvings. The chainsaw cutting bar is modified so it can cut finer detail. It was a well organized and fascinating event.
