Later Ralph's bought them and Gene worked there in total for 30 years.

Gene had made things from wood over the years. One was a bookcase out of 2x12s. It weighed a ton. Gene's wife knew Jim Sparling's wife, that is how he met Jim. Jim told him about a group called the Woodworkers of Whittier. He came to a meeting and liked what he saw. He was inspired by what other members displayed at the show and tell. Gene bought some patterns and made some things. He especially likes making birdhouses. He also likes barns, so he made barn birdhouses, the hard way. He made them using individual slats and shingles!
