The Pictures are of a project that I was hired to do for one of my neighbors. They asked for a small set of stairs for assistance getting into and out of bed. The Stairs are made out of pine and are about 14 inches wide and 19.5 inches high. The handlebar is 44 inches high. Each stair has three ½ inch deep grooves for traction. Under each stair there is a finger groove to help with moving forward or back. The overall weight is also light enough to move.

Finances (Arie K.): End of September balance \$ 3.061.57. Monte Koch tool and wood sales to date \$526. The committee expresses their thanks to Monte's family for their generous donations to the club.

Membership (Steve R.): Currently 39 paid club members. 23 members and 1 guest attended the October club meeting.

Raffle update (Gene G.): \$78 in ticket sales at the previous meeting, and no expenses, for a \$78 profit for the month. YTD profit \$428.

Toy project (Dick T.): 14 sets of blocks completed, now working on blocks for 2023 give away. Approx 1,400 cars completed or in process. Wheels and axles meeting November 10.  with their partnership paperwork.
- Paul provided several club documents: Phone tree for the steering committee members to
 use in the event any info needs to be shared with the club membership on short notice; a
 meeting schedule for 2023; a schedule for the woodcraft classes at adventure park, a list of
 club meeting guest speakers for 2023; and a list of the past winners of the various club
 awards.
- Discussion on how to conduct the show and tell sessions at the club meetings to encourage as many members as possible to participate. Decision to experiment with asking participants to limit their comments to 5 minutes whenever possible.


