Steering Committee Meeting Minutes

Steering Committee Minutes: March 14, 2023

Present: Paul Wilson, Skip Porter, Steve Romo, Arie Korporaal, Dick Toney, Ray Wolven, Paula Wolven

7:00 pm: Meeting called to order – Minutes approved.

Finances (Arie K.): January ending balance \$2,893.73. February ending balance \$3,410.08. Income from dues and donations exceeded club expenses.

Membership (Steve R.): There are 28 paid club members and one compensated member. Steve and Paul to call past (unpaid) members about joining again for this year. March meeting attendance was 22, including 19 members and 3 guests.

Toy project (Dick T.): Approx 50 cars were reworked after the last wheels and axles meeting. The club currently has approx 633 cars. 11 sets of blocks have already been completed, which is the anticipated number needed for 2023. The club is continuing to work on blocks at Hathaway, and is approx 60% completed towards 2024 requirements.

Raffle Update: The March meeting resulted in \$55 in sales, against \$18.69 in expenses. Year to date \$196 in tickets sold, \$75.50 in expenses, and \$45 has already been assigned to this year's Christmas party fund.

New Business:

- Paul volunteers to track refreshment expenses for the meetings. The club wants to assure that donations are sufficient to cover the expense.
- Paula Wolven volunteers to help as designated club photographer.
- Discussion about finding volunteers to support the Founders day activities. Decision made
 to give cars away to children. The Whittier Art Assoc and Gallery has again graciously
 volunteered to allow the children to decorate the cars in their booth, using markers this year
 instead of paint. The committee also approved a \$30 expense for the club booth reservation
 and \$100 for our club name on their banner. Steve, Dick, Skip and Arie generously
 volunteered donations during the meeting to cover most of the expense. Motion approved to
 use 2 boxes of cars for the give away.
- Skip suggested, and the committee agreed to research the idea for rubber stamping the club name on the bottom of all cars given away.
- Club meetings at the Whittier community center have been officially reserved through September. The balance of the year wil be reserved when the City opens the reservation window for those months.
- Discussion about a letter the club might use asking for donations. Arie provided a draft that was reviewed and approved.
- Discussion about planning for the 30th anniversary party. The committee agreed to raise the issue at the next general meeting.

Upcoming Meeting Schedules: The next general club meeting will be April 13, and the next steering committee meeting will be held April 18. Both to be held at the Whittier community center. The next woodcraft class at Adventure Park rescheduled for April 4 to allow for completion of the Easter projects before Easter. May woodcraft classes will be on the 11th and 23rd.
