Steering Committee Minutes: January 17, 2023

7:00 pm: Meeting called to order – Minutes approved.

Finances (Arie K.): Year End December balance \$2,893.73 The committee to hold a routine audit of the books during the next meeting..

Membership (Steve R.): There are 21 paid club members after the first meeting for 2023. The prices for wood, and engraving has gone up and it was suggested the club charge \$10 for replacement of a members badge. Steering committee approved the charge.

Toy project (Dick T.): The club currently has approx 550 cars, plus wheels and axles to complete a total of approx 1,200 cars. Final results from December toy distribution day are still pending. During the distribution at Hathaway two charities indicated they would like to receive more cars, and one charity indicated they would like to start receiving cars with the blocks they have been receiving to date. The committee approved a suggestion to make pens this year to be given to the persons that pick up their cars and blocks at Hathaway, to hopefully motivate the charities to pick up instead of having a club member deliver them. Idea to be presented to the club at the next meeting to see if there is any interest to do this.

Raffle Update: The January meeting resulted in \$66 in sales, against \$31.99 in expenses. \$10 has been assigned to this year's Christmas party fund.

New Business:

- Proposal approved to buy more club postcards and business cards. New artwork necessary to show the new club meeting location as the Whittier Community center.
- It has been determined that Parnell Park can again be used for the club Christmas party. The usual \$200 deposit will need to be paid. Steering committee discussed and approved for the club to return to Parnell Park for the party.
- The club's 30th anniversary celebration was discussed. The date of July 13th was suggested and approved. The suggestion to form a committee to plan the celebration was also discussed and approved. Skip Porter graciously volunteered to chair the committee.

Upcoming Meeting Schedules: The next general club meeting will be February 9 at the Whittier Community Center. The next steering committee meeting will be held March 14 at the Whittier community center. The February steering meeting has been canceled. The next woodcraft classes at Adventure Park are scheduled for February 7 and 28.
