

May Club Meeting Guest Speaker - Steve Romo

We will be fortunate to have Steve Romo talk to us at the May club meeting about his many woodworking activities. We received this note and pictures from him so we can see what he does. Thank you Steve!

Steve has been Woodworking for 56 years and has been woodturning for about 25 years. Steve has a BFA (Bachelor of Fine Arts) degree from CSULB, Cal State University Long Beach. During college is when Steve was first introduced to woodturning. The instructor did not have much experience with the lathe, but did the best he could. After graduation, Steve took additional classes at Cerritos Community College to improve his overall woodworking skills. For several years, Steve worked at Cerritos Community Education as an aide and began teaching his own courses in 2019. Steve also teaches beginning woodturning and bowl turning at the Woodcraft store in Fountain Valley.

Steve is a member of the American Association of Woodturners (AAW), one of the largest woodturning groups in the world. In addition, Steve is an active member of the Segmented Woodturning Association, a subchapter of the AAW. Steve has been a member of the Woodworkers of Whitter since 2019 and has been the membership officer for the last 2 years.

Steve will be doing a turning demonstration featuring some embellishing techniques that you can apply to your turnings.



Steering Committee Meeting Minutes

Steering Committee Minutes: April 18, 2023

Present: Paul Wilson, Skip Porter, Steve Romo, Arie Korporaal, Dick Toney, Gene Getz, Jim Sparling, Ron Holtz, Ray Wolven, Paula Wolven

7:00 pm: Meeting called to order – Minutes approved.

Finances (Arie K.): March ending balance \$3,283.54. \$245.36 in income from dues, donations and the raffle. \$371.90 in expenses for the Christmas party room deposit, the Founders Day table reservation, and misc expenses.

Membership (Steve R.): There are 28 paid club members and one compensated member. Steve and Paul to call past (unpaid) members about joining again for this year. April meeting attendance was 19 members and 1 guest.

Toy project (Dick T.): 11 sets of blocks done for 2023, continuing to work on blocks at Hathaway towards 2024 requirements. Ray Sosa generously donated 120 car bodies for the car project. A discussion was started about which charities to maintain on the list of active charities, and which ones might need to be dropped. The toy committee is expected to make final recommendations after further consideration. Jim Sparling opened a conversation about the number of blocks being given to each charity was larger in the past than it is now. The committee agreed to continue with the current quantity. Another discussion was started about what might be done at Hathaway once enough blocks are made for both 2023 and 2024. It was discussed that other kinds of toys such as cars and airplanes could be made there that might interest other club members, and that the club already has permission from the Hathaway Ranch to make other things besides blocks. The matter was tabled for future conversations.

Raffle Update: The April meeting resulted in \$75 in sales. Year to date \$260 in tickets sold. This month \$25 was dedicated to the club general fund, and \$50 to the Christmas party fund.

New Business:

- Discussion about Founders day activities. Ray Sosa has volunteered to demonstrate Scroll saw work, and Steve Romo has volunteered to demonstrate turning.
- Discussion about a letter the club might use asking for donations for the anniversary party. A final version was reviewed and approved.
- Discussion about planning for the 30th anniversary party. The committee agreed to arrange the food as a potluck by the members like the Christmas party.

Upcoming Meeting Schedules: The next general club meeting will be May 11, and the next steering committee meeting will be held May 16. Both to be held at the Whittier community center. The next woodcraft classes at Adventure Park are scheduled for May 9th and May 23rd.
