Steering Committee Meeting Minutes

Steering Committee Minutes: September 19, 2023

7:00 pm: Meeting called to order – Minutes approved.

Finances (Arie K.): August ending bank balance \$3,439.10.

Membership (Steve R.): There are 35 paid club members and two compensated members. July meeting attendance was 24 members and no guests.

Toy project (Dick T.): Cars inventory = Approx 1000 cars in inventory - some without wheels and axles. The anticipated amount of blocks to be given away in 2023 are completed, and 40% of them have now been bagged and are ready for distribution. 80% of blocks expected to be needed in 2024 are completed.

Raffle Project Update: The last meeting resulted in \$103 in tickets sold against expenses of \$9.99. YTD totals are \$464 in sales and \$188.76 in Expenses. YTD \$300 has been earmarked for the Christmas party fund - our goal for the year has been reached!

New Business:

- Proposal for 2024 club meeting dates and steering committee meeting dates was reviewed and approved.
- Discussion on a new idea for the club members to be given cards in the club meeting for them to pose questions about woodworking, and for the answers to be posted in the next Pushstick. The questions will be reviewed at the next steering committee

- meeting, and appropriate responses will be determined there. The motion was voted on and approved.
- Proposal discussed and approved to make new videos for the website and club facebook page showing how the blocks and cars are made. Further discussion about who will make the videos, and where, to be determined later.
- Discussion and agreement to make December 4 the distribution day at Hathaway. The toy committee is to start making arrangements with the various charities to pick up or ask the club to deliver to them. No other activities at Hathaway are currently planned for December.

Upcoming Meeting Schedules: The next general club meeting will be October 12, and the next steering committee meeting will be held October 17, both at the Whittier community center.
