

The Push Stick

Finish Talk



At the August meeting Lou Barcelot from Rockler Woodworking in Orange <https://www.rockler.com/retail/stores/ca/orange-store> came to talk to us about how to apply finishes to our wood projects. California, Los Angeles County in particular, keeps removing finish options from store shelves. Oil based finishes have disappeared making it harder to get a good finish on a project you spent a lot of time on. On a nice piece of wood the aim is to get “chatoyance” Lou said. Chatoyance is a French word meaning “cat’s eye”. It’s that deep 3D effect that makes the woodgrain pop when you have a well polished finish. Lou said water based finishes do not soak into the wood like oil based do, so light is not reflected the same.

With the limited options we have locally, Lou showed us some alternatives. He had samples he made using mineral, boiled lindseed, walnut and tung oils. These are simple old school finishes that can be waxed and polished to give them a shine. Another benefit is they can be repaired if damaged without having to refinish the whole piece. He passed around samples and they looked very nice.

Some of us, when we travel, pick up finishes we can’t get here. We build up an inventory. Lou pointed out that finishes go bad over time. They don’t put a date on the can, so you don’t know how long it has been sitting in the store. Another tip he had was semigloss and satin clear finishes are just gloss with dulling agents added. These sink to the bottom of the can and are hard to mix evenly. Instead you can just use gloss and dull the finish with an abrasive like fine steel wool.

Thirty minutes is not much time to talk about how to use finishes. Whole books are written on the subject. Lou did a great job in the time given. When you are in the Rockler store in the City of Orange on Tustin Avenue, look him up. Thanks Lou!
