I stopped by long time WOW member and Hunter Smith award winner Monte Koch's house recently to get his story. "How did you get into woodworking?", I asked. Born in 1926, he started as a child in his father's basement shop in Stockton, CA. His father liked metal working, but figured turning wood on his metal lathe was safer for Monte than metal. Turns out he liked turning wood better anyway. When Monte went to school there was one vocational school for the district. He got to go there two Fridays a month. He gravitated to the wood shop, where they had lathes he could happily make shavings with.

High School ended, but Uncle Sam was waiting for him as WWII was raging. Monte chose the Navy where he ended up as a Radioman on a converted Merchant Marine ship for transporting aircraft. First trip was west coast to east coast. The ship was too big for the Panama Canal so they had to go around South America. One night they heard a big crash, but could find nothing wrong with the ship. Later in dry dock they could see a big dent in the side of the ship where a torpedo had hit. Good thing it was a dud!!



He worked at various places picking up different skills ending up at Bechtel in Santa Fe Springs. An engineering firm, they were building power plants all over the world. He became a troubleshooter/ inspector on welding and finishes, traveling to different sites, he even went to China.

Monte told me he has always done woodworking in his spare time and his favorite tool is still the lathe. You can see the segmented bowls he has made in the picture. He also likes the scroll saw. His shop is a shed in the backyard with a lot of character. It reminds me of an old-time hardware store with "treasures" hidden in the nooks and crannies. He even has his father's Atlas drill press in there.

Monte became a member of WOW in the early days. His daughter, Robbie, estimates it was at least 20 years ago. A friend of his belonged to WOW and invited him to join. Thank you Monte for your story and being a part of the WOW family for all these years.
